EVENT STRUCTURE

WTT has developed and released earlier a modern and new event structure fit for professional table tennis players, fans, broadcasters, cities, hosts and sponsors. Additionally, WTT has also announced a new youth event structure that will showcase the phenomenal talent of our future table tennis stars.

The WTT Feeder Series, a critical element of WTT's initial planned structure strategy, comes to complement the pyramid of new events, as a tier designed for elevating grassroot talent to global stars. The new WTT events structure now establishes the journey from Day 1 to World Number 1 and unlocks our sport's potential. It encourages and supports Member Associations all over the world to further develop existing scouting and training systems, plus generate clear pathways to the top of the sport.

WIT FEEDER SERIES

PANG YEW EN KOEN [SINGAPORE] 19 years old. Ranked 10th in the U19 Category. Quarterfinalist at the 2018 Youth Olympic Games, Buenos Aires. Gold medalist in the Seniors category at the 2019 South East Asian Games held in Olongapo. The WTT Feeder Series has commenced in 2022 and provides an additional and valuable opportunity for Member Associations to host events and assist the transition of their players to elite levels.

As young players earn ITTF Table Tennis World Ranking points through the WTT Youth Series, the most elite young players can graduate directly to the WTT Contender Series.

However, many young players will finish their youth journey requiring a little more time to develop and hone their skills before they qualify for this level. The WTT Feeder Series is designed to provide this opportunity, ensuring that young players showing high potential, but still maturing, do not drop off the map.

The WTT Feeder Series also provides a "safety net" for those players formerly of the upper echelons who fall out of form, are returning from career breaks or recovering from injury. This provides the opportunity for all to play, earn prize money and accrue World Ranking points to build back up to WTT Contender Series.

Transition through each of the various tiers is an important part of a player's journey. The WTT Feeder Series and WTT Contender Series both have "optional entry" policies to ensure these competitions are more achievable and accessible for upand-comers.

Participation of the Top 50 players depending on the event type is limited, opening up the adrenalin-fueled, fan-filled global competitive experience to more players. At the same time, the new structure opens the door for more shock upsets, more unexpected match ups, and a more exciting experience for players, fans, and viewers.





BENEFITS OF HOSTING


Hosting WTT events brings extensive benefits to a host city, region and country. From tangible financial and economic impacts, through increased hotel bed nights and associated spending, to destination marketing and increased levels of community engagement and social pride through volunteering, participating and spectating.

WTT invites member associations, host countries, cities or organisations with the support of their member association, to apply for these events, which are designed to help event hosts not only develop their players, but also gain valuable experience in event planning and organization. WTT is determined to create a platform which provides opportunities for players across the globe to compete in international events, develop and shine.

An inclusive sport, table tennis does not require intensive infrastructure or equipment and is accessible to all. With entry places for host nations, staging these events will give Member Associations and countries access to competitions and ensure that home-grown talent will be able to participate in these highly international competitive events, earning valuable World Ranking points and international exposure.

EVENT REQUIREMENTS

The table below lists the basic and general requirements of a WTT Feeder Series event:

NT REQUIREMENTS WTT FEEDER SERIES EVENT REQUIREMENTS
A ratio of 1:2 practice tables for each competition table. Where a venue is not able to accommodate this requirement due to size restrictions, WTT will consider as a minimum standard, a ratio of 1:1.5 practice tables for each competition table. ICE TABLES Any event that selects the maximum qualifying singles size must provide a ratio of 1:2 practice tables for each competition table. Where an event has less than 8 competition tables, the LOC must provide a minimum of 12 practice tables.
LOC to establish a promotional plan for the event. EACH event shall display the WTT Feeder Series logo and utilise the WTT central branding template provided by WTT for venue overlay, accreditation and event advertising. Each LOC will be required to design and implement all branding material, consistent with the WTT branding theme and seek approval from WTT prior to implementation.
S PRESENTATION LOC encouraged to deliver sports presentation across all days of the event, to enhance the fan and player experience.
Official Hospitality Packages The rates must include room rate, full board, complimentary Wi-Fi, all services and tax charges, and should be up to USD\$ 200 / EUR ~170 per person in a Double Room and up to USD\$ 240 / EUR ~205 for one person in a Single Room. The LOC may offer official hospitality packages in more than one hotel, WTT's preference is for one official hotel for all players and participants. Hospitality rates must be appropriate to the level of the hotel(s) offered. Accreditation Only Package Players and participants who do not select an official hospitality package will be issued an event accreditation for USD\$ 400 / EUR ~340 per person.

PHASE BREAKDOWN

PHASE 1 OPENING & SUBMISSION OF APPLICATIONS

The first phase consists of the opening of the application process by WTT, with the release of the promotional details, event manual and application process released to the market.

The phase is concluded with the submission of applications by potential hosts, who are committed to host a WTT Feeder Series event. Potential hosts are expected to invest time in reading, understanding, and following the detailed WTT Feeder Series Event Manual and Annexes.

PHASE 2 EVALUATION OF APPLICATIONS

Following receipt of final applications from potential hosts, WTT will go through the evaluation process and may contact potential hosts for further clarifications, discussions and details on their final application.

WTT will evaluate all applications on a case-by-case basis with the main focus on the following criteria for allocation of events:

- + Venue and technical ability of the host to deliver the event
- + Hospitality conditions for participants
- + Market (table tennis market or new table tennis market)
- + Ability to establish table tennis events for long term
- + Financial stability
- + Operational experience

PHASE 3 HOST ALLOCATION

Following the evaluation of applications, WTT will proceed with the allocation of events and inform potential hosts accordingly.

WTT will finalize the hosting details with the successful hosts and confirm the 2023 calendar allocations. Inspections will be planned, as needed and depending on the time each event will take place.
